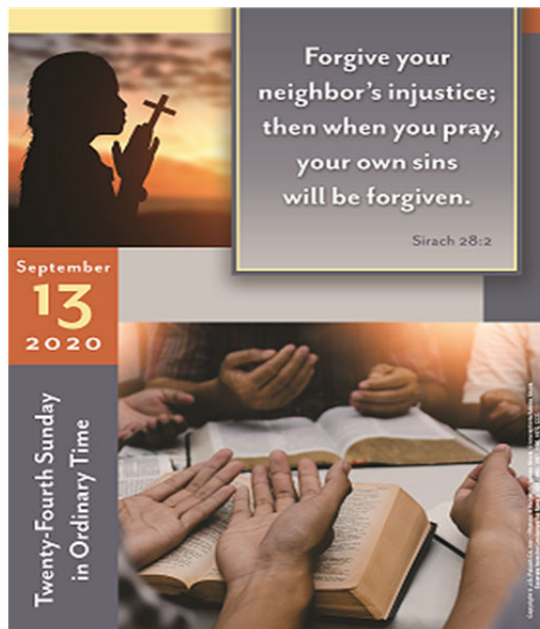
PARISH REGISTRATION: We welcome new parishioners to share fully in our Parish life. As new members you bring vitality and growth to our parish.

You may call the Parish Office to have a registration form mailed to you or stop by and complete a registration form at the Parish Office. You may also use the Parish web site iopnc.org to register online, **please call to confirm that your online registration was received.**

BAPTISM: Parental Attendance at a Preparation Class for the first child to be baptized is mandatory. This class is held on the last Sunday of each month at 1:30 PM in the Parish Hall, and in Spanish on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of the month at 7PM in the Hall. Pre-registration is not required. To have your child baptized you must meet the following requirements (1) be a registered parishioner for at least three months (2) be practicing the faith (3) have obtained the signed Godparent Eligibility form and returned them to the Parish Office. Please check the bulletin monthly for possible changes of class dates. **Parents planning to have children baptized in the near future can contact the Parish Office in advance to obtain Godparent Eligibility Forms, these forms will need to be returned to the Parish Office before any baptism date will be scheduled.**

MARRIAGE: Arrangements must be made with a Parish Priest at least six months before your requested date. To be married at Infant of Prague you must be a registered member of our Parish for at least six months.

ANointing OF THE SICK: If you have a loved one who is in the hospital, a nursing home or homebound and in need of anointing please notify the Parish Priest at 910-347-4196 after hours please call 910-581-3101. Remember we can't make visitations to people when we are unaware of their situation.

NEXT WEEKENDS SECOND COLLECTION: SCHOOL SUPPORT



My fellow parishioners, Please remember a dispensation by the Bishop has waved the obligation to attend Sunday Mass for those who have health concerns. We have begun having mass in the Church at 5:00 PM mass on Saturday, 8:00 AM, 10:00 AM masses on Sunday and a 1:00 PM Spanish mass. To comply with the social distancing guidelines we are only able to accommodate 250 parishioners per mass. To attend Mass will be on a first come first serve basis until we reach the 250 capacity. ***With the new guidelines of our Governor you will be required to wear a mask. Please place your mask on before exiting your vehicles, anyone who comes to the doors of the Church without a mask will not be permitted into the Church.*** Mask may be removed when you are in the pews but must be worn for communion. If you do not make the 250 to attend in the church, or you do not feel comfortable participating inside the church, you can still participate outside while listening in your vehicles via an FM Transmitter or live stream on your phone. Currently the masses will be streamed on FM 88.1, this is subject to change due to frequency tuning, please be patient with us and look for any changes on the church Face Book page. Communion will be offered to those who choose to listen in their vehicles as well, more information below. In order to have a safe and reverent liturgy, we ask that you adhere to the following guidelines: - If you are at high risk for health issues, please use your best judgment. If you would like to use a mask in church, feel free to do so. - The church will be open 30 minutes prior to mass and will be closed 10 minutes after the conclusion of mass. - We will have one entrance open to the Church. All Parishioners will only be able to enter through the main entrance. This will give our ushers an opportunity to guide the parishioners to their seating

area. - There will be no collection during the mass to avoid everyone touching the collection basket. We will instead have a basket at the main entrance for offertory collections. - For those Parishioners listening in their vehicles or live streaming outside the church, we ask that you line up by the door to the adoration chapel. A Eucharistic Minister will be present to distribute communion. - After the final blessing, our ushers will assist with the dismissal. All three doors will be available for exiting. Please no loitering after mass in the church or on the property. Please continue to be patient and pray for an end to this pandemic and healing for all those infected.

To serve the goals of R.C.I.A., sponsors must be active, practicing Catholics. The ideal sponsor is mature in their faith and active, so as to connect their candidate or catechumen to the parish, via parish activities, ministry, and overall parish life, and be objective in their judgment of a person's readiness or calling. Parishioners interested in becoming an R.C.I.A. sponsor must:

- Be at least 18 years old;
- Be fully initiated in the Catholic Church (Baptism, Confirmation, 1st Holy Communion),
- If married, current marriage was witnessed by a Catholic priest .

RELIGIOUS ARTICLES ROOM OPEN:

In order to stay in compliance with Governor Cooper's mandates during Covid-19, the Religious Articles Room will be open for business with the following stipulations:

BVM SHRINE & COLUMBARIA UPDATE

Blessed Virgin Shrine and Parish Columbarium. Construction is completed on a privately-funded Shrine building for the Blessed Virgin Mary and nearly completed for a Parish Columbaria.

BVM Shrine. The Shrine structure is complete and will have a statue of our Lady of Grace on a pedestal and a large Miraculous Medal, (front and back), on a wall behind her statue. A few benches will be located in front of the Statue. Behind the wall will be an Altar for Committal services from the Rite of Christian Funerals for those interred in the IOP Columbaria. The shrine will be accessed from the parking lot immediately behind the entrance to the Adoration Chapel.

Columbaria. The Columbaria is for Parishioners who chose to be cremated and desire that their remains be interred on the grounds of their church. The Columbaria will have “Niches” that will hold two Urns. Each Niche will have a granite door with engraved information on the deceased.

The cost of internment in the IOP Columbaria is \$2,200 for two urns, including engraving and perpetual maintenance (does not include the urn).

Shrubbery and small trees will be placed along the sides of the Shrine and the sides and rear of the Columbaria. The Columbaria will be accessed directly from the adjacent parking lot.

Anticipated completion dates for these privately-funded projects:

1. Shrine structure is complete.
2. Columbaria and Altar construction by late September.
3. Installation of the BVM Statue by mid-October.
4. Completion of landscaping by late October to mid November 2020.

GOD’S MERCY

In many of our relationships with others—friends, spouse, neighbors, or co-workers—often the most difficult times come when someone damages the relationship. There are moments when only apology and forgiveness can lead to healing. In this week’s readings, we are reminded how our connection with God is woven into our relationships with others. God is the source of all mercy, and all of us stand in need of forgiveness. As we are able to accept the mercy of God deep within our hearts, we become empowered to show mercy to others. When things go badly in our relationships, we can remember that God is present at the center of these difficult moments. God is offering grace to ask forgiveness, to receive apology, and to accept the forgiveness extended to us.

FORGIVEN AND FORGIVING

In today’s Gospel, Jesus calls his followers to forgive “seventy-seven” times. In other words, stop keeping track when forgiving others. But when we are hurt, this is really hard to do. In fact, to protect ourselves from further hurt, we might be inclined to do the opposite, and lash out. Jesus teaches the futility of this approach.

Jesus’ parable of the unforgiving servant reminds us that in the course of our lives we have harmed others, and so distanced ourselves from God. We have also been harmed by others. Like the servant, we sometimes owe a debt, and sometimes others owe a debt to us. Here we are invited to stop the cycle of pain with the grace of mercy. We are called to imitate our God, who forgives wholeheartedly.

PROTECTING THE VULNERABLE

It is also tempting to view this teaching on forgiveness in isolation. This would suggest that the burden is placed entirely upon the offended person to go on forgiving, without mentioning any accountability on the part of the offending person. This interpretation can often be dangerous. The call to forgive should never be used as a cover for bullying or for oppressive relationships of any kind.

It is helpful to consider all of chapter 18 in Matthew’s Gospel, which teaches about forgiveness and reconciliation, and the exercise of authority in the Christian community. Last week’s Gospel (Matthew 18:15–18) provides guidance on how Christians can call to accountability someone who has hurt others, to protect the weak, and to seek reconciliation as a community. The parable we hear today reminds us that, like the master who protected the second servant from the cruelty of the unforgiving servant, God seeks to guard the most vulnerable from harm.

The Gospel of Matthew presented an alternative to the violence-based order of his day. Matthew described Jesus’ vision of community, in which power is used at the service of all and the vulnerable are protected and cherished.
